Who are carers?

Carers are people who provide ongoing, unpaid support to people who need it because of disability, chronic illness, mental illness or frail age. This includes foster carers who are caring for a child who needs additional support due to one or more of these conditions.

The Strategy is supported by NSW Government action plans every two years. This third action plan covers initiatives to be delivered during the calendar years of 2025 and 2026.

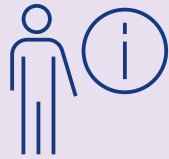
The action plans evidence the NSW Government's cross-agency commitment to achieving the visions and priorities presented in the Strategy. They capture initiatives that government agencies and Carers NSW will deliver to better support people in NSW who have caring responsibilities.

Most ongoing actions carried over from the second action plan have become business-as-usual activities within NSW Government, demonstrating agencies' commitment to recognising and supporting carers.

Actions in this plan are for all carers living in NSW or for specific carer cohorts such as multicultural communities, government agency clients and government agency employees. Carers can also potentially be part of an action target group in other NSW Government strategies, such as the Ageing Well in NSW and NSW Women's Strategy. Refer to those strategies for further information about initiatives that may also support carers.

Please note: Initiatives are listed under a primary priority within this action plan, as determined by the lead agency responsible for that particular action. However, all actions listed address more than one priority of the NSW Carers Strategy.

The NSW Carers Strategy has four priorities:



Priority 1:

Carers have better access to information services and supports.



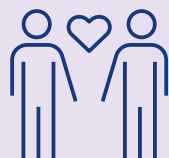
Priority 2:

<p>1 Carers Investment Grant program</p> <p>The Carers Investment Grant Program will fund initiatives that develop, pilot and implement ongoing training and education programs for service providers to better identify and reach unidentified carers and provide them with information about how to get support. Supported by funding of \$3.1 million over two years, the grant initiatives will be implemented from April 2025 to April 2027.</p> <p> Timeframe: 3rd Action Plan</p>	Department of Communities and Justice
<p>2 Multicultural NSW employees' access to carer information and supports</p> <p>Provide Multicultural NSW employees with access to information and supports for carers including through consideration of targeted carer awareness initiatives and human resources activities.</p> <p> Timeframe: 3rd Action Plan</p>	Multicultural NSW
<p>3 Carer awareness across multicultural communities</p> <p>Promote existing carer information and support resources through Multicultural NSW's communication and stakeholder channels with the aim of raising awareness across multicultural communities.</p> <p> Timeframe: 3rd Action Plan</p>	Multicultural NSW
<p>4 NSW Carers Advisory Council action</p> <p>The NSW Carers Advisory Council will continue to identify emerging opportunities for the Minister to improve recognition and wellbeing of the diverse range of carers living in NSW. The Carers Advisory Council will continue to provide strategic advice to the Minister and the Government on issues relating to Carers to encourage increased recognition of their needs.</p> <p> Timeframe: 3rd Action Plan</p>	NSW Carers Advisory Council
<p>5 Pharmacists + Carers (PharmaC)</p> <p>Carers NSW in partnership with the Pharmaceutical Society of Australia will design and develop online, self-directed care awareness learning resources for pharmacists in NSW to support the identification and support of carers in pharmacy settings.</p> <p> Timeframe: 3rd Action Plan</p>	Carers NSW

<p>6 Carer Planning Hub</p> <p>Carers NSW will draw together existing information and resources to establish a centralised online hub that supports carers to plan and prepare for the future, including financial planning, emergency and disaster planning and planning for transitioning out of the caring role.</p> <p> Timeframe: 3rd Action Plan</p>	Carers NSW
<p>7 Department of Communities and Justice (DCJ) to promote the use of the Workplace Adjustment Passport to assist employees who are carers</p> <p>The DCJ Workplace Adjustment Passport creates a single living document that captures adjustment needs and agreed arrangements for the employee and manager. It minimises the need to re-negotiate adjustments and provides a basis for discussion when adjustment needs change. DCJ will seek to promote and encourage increased engagement and uptake of the Passport for employees who are carers.</p> <p> Timeframe: 3rd Action Plan</p>	Department of Communities and Justice
<p>8 DCJ Carers + Employers Level 3 Accreditation</p> <p>DCJ has been successful in obtaining both Level 1 and Level 2 accreditation through the Carers + Employers Program. Level 3 'Excel' is the highest level of accreditation for organisations who have embedded carer friendly workplace practices and would like to be recognised as leaders.</p> <p> Timeframe: 3rd Action Plan</p>	Department of Communities and Justice
<p>9 Department of Planning, Housing and Infrastructure (DPHI) to embed carers needs into Disability Inclusion Action Plan (DIAP) actions</p> <p>DPHI will investigate ways to better support people with disability and their carers across the areas of community engagement, internal communication, community events and public spaces.</p> <p> Timeframe: 3rd Action Plan</p>	Department of Planning, Housing and Infrastructure
